
Figure 3 – Applications to waive/reduce post-public employment cooling-off period, 2015 to 2020

Decisions made under the Act in 2020

- The Commission may make decisions under sections 10, 14 and 22 of the Act, which may be appealed.
- There were no applications made to delay publication of a return to the register under section 14 of the Act.
- Nine investigations into possible unreported or unregistered lobbying carried over from the previous year. Three further investigations were launched and 11 closed by year-end. One investigation carried over into 2021.
- In 2020, eight former DPOs applied for a reduction/waiver of their post-employment provisions the largest number since the Act commenced. The Commission became aware of two former DPOs who did not apply but, in the view of the Commission, should have sought consent to take up a particular employment.

The Second Legislative Review of the Act

The Second Legislative Review of the Act, launched in 2019, and concluded in February 2020. None of the Commission's recommendations were endorsed in the report, published by the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform. On foot of calls for reform, a new review was launched in late 2020, and expanded to encompass recommendations made by the Commission to previous reviews. The review is expected to conclude in 2021.
